Introduction

Eos Family consoles take a long time to design and get to manufacturing, so when we release a new product, we tend to manufacture the same design for 7-8 years. As technology rapidly moves forward and the needs of our users change, it has become useful for us to do a mid-life update to the internal components of our consoles.

We did mid-life updates for Ion Classic, Element Classic, Gio, and Ti – and now we are embarking on a mid-life update for our 2nd Generation (Gen2) products.

Over the next few weeks, we will begin shipping new consoles with these enhancements, which are also being called "Windows 10 Updates".

W10 Hardware: Features Overview

Here are the **new** features (details are on the next few pages):

- Support for 4k External Displays for larger displays and crisper graphics
- USB v3.1 on motherboard ports for faster file transfers
- USB-C ports on rear for connecting modern drives & devices
- WiFi network adapter not enabled now, future connections to wifi networks
- Bluetooth radio not enabled now, future connections to user input accessories
- Improved CPU performance helps with larger rigs, and graphical tasks like Augment3d
- Larger solid-state hard drive additional storage, faster read/write
- Factory Restore from hard drive no USB stick needed
- Windows 10 security patches *support against future threats to W10-embedded systems*


W10 Hardware: What's the same?



- Net3 RVI3






W10 Feature Details: External Monitors

All W10 consoles natively support displays up to 4k resolution

- Displays supported: 1920x1080 minimum, 3840x2160 maximum
- Eos v3.1 software includes High-DPI support
- High-DPI monitors can give more real-estate, but also are less strenuous on the eyes during long programming sessions
- Eos v3.1.1 will bring additional monitorsplitting capabilities
- Eos v3.1.0 supports DDC/CI monitors, to control their dimming from within the software





W10 Feature Details: USB

W10 consoles come with USB 3.1 on all motherboard ports, and two of the ports are now USB-C.

- USB 3.1 protocol brings communication speeds up to 10Gb/second (For persnickety folks, we are *technically* using USB 3.1 Gen2x1)
- USB-C connectors are found on many modern devices, and will allow future compatibility with ETC and third-party products.
- USB-C plugs are reversable (there is no "up or down" they can plug it in either way)






W10 Feature Details: WiFi & Bluetooth

W10 consoles include WiFi and Bluetooth radios

- Both radios will be non-functional when we begin shipping. We will enable them in Eos v3.2 software (expected late summer)
- The WiFi Ethernet adapter is 802.11ac, and should be equated to a laptop WiFi adapter.
 - When enabled, we will use it to connect to a lighting network's wireless access point (not an internet-connected WAP), for connections to apps, OSC triggers, remote file access, etc.
 - We will not allow multiconsole connections via WiFi, nor allow output (sACN or Art-Net) via the WiFi connection.
 - We expect to offer more features via a WiFi connection in future software.
- The Bluetooth 5.1 radio, when enabled, will allow the user to connect human input accessories, like a mouse, a keyboard, SpaceMouse, or other devices.
- All W10 products can be ordered with "No Radios," for regions/sites that do not want wireless radios in their devices. Talk with Customer Service or Quotations if you need to order a No-Radio device.








W10 Feature Details: Performance Updates

- Improved CPU performance consoles now have 40% more processing power, enabling Eos software to chug through bigger magic sheets, larger Augment3d models, and much more.
- Larger solid-state hard drive we now include a 256GB NVMe hard drive, for more storage and faster read/write capabilities.
- Factory Restore from hard drive if a console needs reimaging, the user will be able to do it directly from the hard drive, instead of needing to wait for technical services to mail them an image stick.
- Windows 10 security patches W10-embedded systems have enhanced protection against future threats. And though we still don't recommend internet connections to the desk, we will be capable of patching new vulnerabilities via software update.

W10 Software & Compatibility

W10 consoles will require Eos v3.1.0 (or above)

- W10 consoles will not ship with nor be able to run v2.9.x software, and therefore will not be able to join multiconsole sessions with devices running v2.9.x
- We will move repairs over to using W10 components, and save some W7 components for desks that absolutely need it

"If I'm talking to a user, how do they tell the difference between a W7- and a W10based console?"

• Only W10-based consoles will have USB-C ports

W10 Output Protocol Support

We are unable to continue support of some output protocols on W10 platforms.

- The following protocols will no longer be supported on W10-based devices (including the new Puck) and ETCnomad:
 - Draft sACN
 - Net2 EDMX
 - AVAB UDP

Windows 10-based consoles will continue to output sACN and Art-Net

FAQs for W7 Consoles

With W10 consoles showing up in the field, some users may have questions about our plans for their W7 consoles:

- Development: our software development plans for the foreseeable future include releasing new features that will install on W7- and W10-based consoles.
- This is not like Windows XP, where we were forced to cease development for those consoles because of difficulties in developing and supporting that platform.
- The W10 hardware features may be desirable to some users, but are not necessary to continue installing new software. If users ask about upgrade options for their W7 consoles, check out the next few pages.

W7 > W10 Upgrade Program

Later in the year, we will begin offering W10 upgrades for users who find the hardware features desirable, similar to our previous XP>W7 program

- The following consoles will be eligible to be upgraded:
 - Element 2
 - Ion Xe, Ion Xe 20, Ion Xe RPU
 - Gio @5
 - Eos RPU3
 - Net3 RVI3
- The consoles will need to be returned to our repairs department, where we will replace the necessary internal components
- Pricing and availability have not been set yet we will make announcements when we are ready to roll out this program

ETC Puck

"ETCnomad Puck" is now "ETC Puck"! This next-generation mini-processor has many of the same features as our W10 consoles:

- W10-embedded environment
- Double the processing power of the previous generation Puck
- 2 external monitors, up to 4k resolution
 - One Display Port connector, one HDMI connector
- 2 gigabit network adapters
- 802.11ax WiFi adapter (enabled in future software)
- Bluetooth 5.0 radio (enabled in future software)
- USB 3.1 ports (3 USB-A, 2 USB-C)
- Kensington lock port

ETC Puck has new part numbers:

1k: 4380A1143

6k: 4380A1144

There is not a "no-radio" option for ETC Puck.

ETCpad

ETCpad is getting an update! The newer model looks nearly identical to the original, but now includes:

- USB-C charging and data port
- ARCore sensors for Augment3d Focus Wand in the RFR app
- Updated Android embedded OS

ETCpad has a new part number: 4250A1222

- All accessories still work with the new model, and use the same part numbers
- "ETCpad USB Hub Replacement" (P/N: M7599) we are adding a USB-C adapter to the kit, so it can be ordered for users of both generations of ETCpad
